What are Found Sounds?

Found Sounds are sounds created using things that are <u>NOT</u> considered instruments. Awesome musicians like STOMP use found sounds to create music! If you don't remember watching STOMP in class, you can watch it <u>here</u>. You do <u>not</u> have to watch all of it but it can be an awesome brain break for you!

Some found sounds seen and heard throughout STOMP:

- Dribbling basketballs
- Tapping playing cards on a table
- Chopping vegetables
- Sipping from a cup

- Car tires on the pavement
- Buckets sliding on the floor
- Metal pipes in water
- Eating Apples

Your Task:

Now it's your turn to find found sounds! These can be everyday things you hear such as sharpening a pencil, brushing your hair or teeth, the shower running, pots and pans in the kitchen, and so many more!

YOUR TASK: Find **10-20** sounds around your home. Remember, these are not instruments. So pianos, recorders, ukuleles, and guitars are not considered found sounds.
