



Definition: Originating in the 1920s South (Atlanta), Country Music was once called "hillbilly music" and comes from a blend of folk, western, and blues that often uses simple harmonies and string instruments. Peak popularity: 1920s-1950s (subgenres remain popular to the present) U Characteristics: ballads, harmonies, banjos, guitars (steel, electric, acoustic), fiddles, harmonicas, Influenced by: folk, cowboy, jazz, gospel, blues, western tr Influenced: southern rock, rockabilly, bluegrass, honky Tonk Notable Artists: Jimmy Rodgers, Gene Autry, Roy Rogers, Hank Williams, Johnny Cash (rockabilly), Patsy Kline (pop

Artist Spotlight: Jimmy Rodgers

Famous for his rhythmic 'yodeling', Jimmy Rodgers was one of the first commercially successful country singers. In addition to the hit song, "Blue Yodel No. 9", he recorded several albums throughout the 1920s and into the 1930s. Rodgers was nicknamed "The Blue Yodeler", "The Singing Brakeman" and "The Father of Country Music".

Artist Spotlight: Gene Autry

The "Singing Cowboy" Gene Autry was a famous name in radio, movies and television for more than three decades (1930s - 1950s). He appeared in 93 films and on 91 episodes of the Gene Autry Show. Autry is often considered the second-most influential figure in the history of country music (after Jimmie Rodgers). His singing cowboy characters brought country music to the national audience over and over again.

Artist Spotlight: Hank Williams

Known as the "Hillbilly **Shakespeare, Hank Williams** (1923-1953) is arguably one of the most influential artists of the 20th century. He had 35 top ten country hits and 11 number one hits before his drug/alcohol-related heart attack at 29. The likes of Elvis, Bob Dylan, and the Stones have covered his songs and Williams is one of the most celebrated of all country singers. In fact, many modern country songs still reference his name.


Artist Spotlight: Johnny Cash

Known for his deep voice and rebelliousness, Johnny Cash is considered one of the most influential musicians in American history. Beginning primarily as a country music icon, he ultimately created songs across genres such as: rock n' roll, blues, folk and gospel. He is the only artist that is in the Country Music, Rock n' Roll and Gospel Music Hall of Fame.
